- **Call for Abstracts: Gender Renewals? Gender, Work and Organization – International Workshop Series (Free University Amsterdam, The Netherlands)**

What: Conference on 22-24th June, 2011 at the Free University Amsterdam.

Subject: Gender as a central theme in social science research in the field of work and organisation has achieved contemporary significance beyond the confines of early discussions of women at work. Set against the backdrop of the present economic climate, it has been suggested that the impact of business cultures and managerial theories, including current ideas

about 'crisis', render gender a peripheral theme. Moreover, explicitly addressing gender is, in some contexts, seen as increasingly ambivalent in debates over diversity, in negotiations over organizational policies, in general discussions over parenthood, starting families and other links vis-à-vis working life. As a part of the GWO portfolio of activities, the GWO

International Workshop series aims to gather scholars on a distinct theme or topic.

Submission guidelines: Abstracts of approximately 500 words (1 page, Word document, single spaced, excluding references). New and young scholars with 'work in progress' papers

Date: Thursday March 17, 9.30-17.00 hrs

Location: Drift 21, room 0.05, Utrecht

Subject: The Postcolonial Studies Initiative (PCI), in collaboration with the Netherlands Graduate School for Literary Studies (OSL) and the Netherlands Research School of Women's Studies (NOV), organizes a workshop with the scope to apply the tools of postcolonial critique to specific historical and geo-political formations in Europe, which have remained a blind spot in postcolonial critique. We will discuss what makes Europe postcolonial and why the notion of Europe is more contested than ever, both internally (through the proliferations of ethnic, religious, regional differences) and externally (Europe expanding its boundaries but closing its borders). Speakers: Mireille Rosello, Paulo de Medeiros, Sandra Ponzanesi, Birgit Kaiser, Emanuelle Radar.

Submission guidelines: Participants can present their research projects in relation to the topics of Postcolonialism with relation to Europe and the literature provided in the reader. - **Sexual Nationalisms: Gender, Sexuality and the Politics of Belonging in the New Europe (University of Amsterdam, The Netherlands)**

Date: January 27 & 28, 2011

Location: University of Amsterdam, Oudemanhuispoort 4-6.

Subject: In Europe and beyond, the refashioning of citizenship has contributed to the redefinition of secular liberalism as cultural whiteness. Homophobia and conservatism, gender segregation and sexual violence have been represented as alien to modern European culture and transposed upon the bodies, cultures and religions of migrants, especially Muslims and their descendants. In the process, the status of Europe's ethnic minorities as citizens has come under question. How can the entanglement of sexual and gender politics, anti-immigration policies, and the current reinvention of national belonging be analyzed? How are we to understand the appropriation of elements of the feminist and sexual liberation agenda by the Islamophobic right? And how can progressive sexual politics avoid the trap of exclusionary instrumentalization without renouncing its emancipatory promise?

- **2 PhD Vacancies: NWO-VIDI project 'Bodily Integrity in Blemished Bodies' (Maastricht University, The Netherlands)**

What: 2 PhD Vacancies in the NWO-VIDI project 'Bodily Integrity in Blemished Bodies' - Department of Health, Ethics, and Society, Maastricht University.

Programme description: Project 1, 'Ideal Shapes – Shaping Ideality', will explore the way in which cultural body ideals influence breast cancer patients' experience of disfigurement. Project 2, 'Facing one's loss of face', will explore the conditions on which people with disfiguring head and neck cancer cope with their, sometimes irreparable, damaged appearance; whether they find a way to re-identify with their own mirror image; whether they succeed in incorporating (functional or cosmetic) prostheses (e.g. larynx stoma, artificial ear, nose or eye) into their own "body image" and "body scheme".

- **'Transforming Memories in Contemporary Women's Rewriting' by Dr. Liedeke Plate**

Author: Dr. Liedeke Plate (Gender & Cultural Studies, Nijmegen University)

Subject: *Transforming Memories in Contemporary Women's Rewriting* explores the role of rewriting within feminist literature from the 1970's onwards in relation to the theme of cultural memory. It discusses a broad range of European and North American texts and contexts to tease out the internal contradictions of women's rewriting in the transmission of culture. It is a detailed and representative study of how feminist fiction uses rewriting to engage questions of cultural remembrance and forgetting in relation to gendered identity, generating incisive interpretations of works by such authors as Angela Carter, J.M. Coetzee, Maryse Condé, Ursula Le Guin, Sena Jeter Naslund, Pia Pera, Michèle Roberts, Jeanette Winterson and Christa Wolf.
