CALLS FOR PAPERS

Public Integrity Journal "Gender and Ethics"

Subject: Ethical issues pertaining to gender are a palpable undercurrent in our society that at times wells up to capture the attention of the public on a grand scale. The annual comparisons of gender income disparity, reports on the global trade in sexual slavery, policies on same-sex marriage and partner benefits are just a few of the many issues we confront daily. These are topics that engender high levels of emotion yet are rarely analyzed from the perspective of applied ethical theory. This refereed symposium proposes to consider these questions at length and from a variety of perspectives: policy, law, social sciences, global studies, and economics.

Submission guidelines: Proposals for this symposium can take the form of research articles, commentaries, field reports, cases, or book reviews. Please submit proposals for the symposium to cljrkwcz@lsu.edu. Proposals should include the working title and a brief abstract of the manuscript, along with full contact information and affiliation. Selected authors will be determined by mid-August with full papers due 15 January; revisions will be due 15 April 2012.

• PhD position at the Institute of European Ethnology (Ludwig-Maximilian-Universität in Munich, Germany)

What: A 3 year PhD position is available in the Research Project "From Oriental to the Cool City. Changing Imaginations of Istanbul, Cultural Production and the Production of Urban Space", and this position will allow the PhD student to work on her/his own dissertation, which will focus on the Istanbul 2010 European Capital of Culture Program and attempt to identify the Program's role in the consolidation of the emerging image of "cool" Istanbul.

Programme description: The Research Project has an interdisciplinary scope, engaging primarily with issues that concern the fields of Urban Studies and Cultural Studies. Cultural Anthropology, Visual Culture Studies and Urban Geography are also fields that the project will draw on. Candidates with backgrounds in various disciplines are invited to apply.

ARC-GS National Prize for Best Social Science Master Thesis in Gender and Sexuality Studies 2011

What: the Amsterdam Research Center for Gender and Sexuality (ARC-GS) is working to promote gender and sexuality studies within the social sciences at the University of Amsterdam, in the Netherlands and beyond. Besides facilitating research synergies, its educational mission involves encouraging and valorizing advanced social science students working in the field. In this spirit, and to celebrate our first year of existence, the 2011 ARC-GS Prize will award the best gender and/or sexuality studies master thesis in the social scientific disciplines in the Netherlands.

Conditions to qualify: You have completed your master program in the social sciences (sociology, anthropology, political science, geography, economics, history) within a Dutch university. Your thesis must have been completed between October 1st, 2010 and September 30th, 2011. Your thesis can be written in English or in Dutch. Your thesis must be based on theoretically informed empirical research carried out independently. Gender and/or sexuality must be a central element of your research focus. Your obtained grade should be 8,5 or higher.

exhaustive bibliography on books about FGM, it reviews major work on the subject published in languages other than English as well as publications originally disseminated in English. The many translations from German and French provide a service unavailable elsewhere, introducing readers to the wealth of information coming out of Germany and France as well as the Netherlands, Italy, and Spain. The volume is unique and should be very helpful to activists, policy-makers and scholars
