

Submission guidelines: Only advanced research master students and PhD students can submit an abstract. Abstracts for papers (300 words maximum) can be sent to NOV@uu.nl before Tuesday December 14, 2010. Please mention the following details: your name, university, work address, and supervisor(s). Accepted papers are due Tuesday February 1, 2011 and should be submitted to NOV@uu.nl. The final paper has 4500-6000 words (excluding footnotes and references).

Theme: Interdisciplinarity and the New University

Topic: The Graduate Journal of Social Science (GJSS) welcomes contributions for its June 2011 issue on the effects of the 'new university' structure from students and early-career scholars who are struggling with these issues today. Topics include, but are not limited to: How are shifts in funding and education policy changing the types of projects getting funded and the types of research that can be conducted?; examinations of methods and tactics taken during various student-led actions, including responses by administrations, other members of the student body, and by the media at large; and Critical reflections (or experiences) of how these new and evolving circumstances can be approached methodologically.

Submission guidelines: Articles should be between 5000-7000 words in length (including footnotes). The GJSS encourages the submission of work from all disciplines and geographical areas, and particularly from MSc/MA/MS, MPhil, PhD students and junior academics.

Thema: Gender, Materiële Cultuur, Design

Onderwerp: De redactie van het Jaarboek voor Vrouwengeschiedenis 31 (2011) nodigt iedereen die zich aangesproken voelt door het thema Gender, Materiële Cultuur, Design uit om een bijdrage te leveren: kunst- en designhistorici, historici, antropologen, sociologen en literatuurwetenschappers. Papers kunnen gaan over elk onderwerp vanaf de prehistorie tot heden, en elk geografisch gebied. Besproken cases kunnen genderstereotypen bevestigen, onderuit halen of op andere wijze problematiseren.

Richtlijnen paper: Artikelen mogen maximaal 6000 woorden lang zijn, inclusief noten en literatuurverwijzingen, en met een beperkt aantal afbeeldingen. Ze worden door vakreferenten beoordeeld. Bij de artikelen wordt een Engelse samenvatting gevraagd van 150 woorden en een auteursbiografie van 100 woorden. - **Culture, Management and Feminist perspectives 7th Critical Management Studies conference (11 - 13 July, 2011 - Naples, Italy)**

Theme: A call for feminist analysis informing cross-cultural management discourses and practices

Topic: Stream organized by Laurence Romani, Pia Höök, Charlotte Holgersson and Janne Tienari. We invite submission of papers' abstracts-synopsis on topics addressing the lack of feminist perspectives in international management and cross-cultural management. Empirical and theoretical contributions are welcome on the following (but not limited to) topics: Feminist/power analysis of international management, international business and cross-cultural management; To what extent are the concepts, tools and recommendations used in cross-cultural management developed with an implicit masculine norm?; Example of intersectional investigations in international or cross-cultural management, and their contributions; Feminist/power analysis of international or cross-cultural management education; Theoretical frameworks enabling feminist/power perspectives for cross-cultural management analyses.

- **Does your scholarly work focus on lesbians and gays in formal politics?**

Building up a LGBTQ network

Theme: We would like to get connected with other scholars in social sciences who share our enthusiasm to explore the topic of lesbian and gay politics and politicians, gay and lesbian issues in institutionalized politics and state policies, as well as research on the heteronormativity of (formal) democratic processes from interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary perspectives.

Topic: Again, while a lot of research has been focusing on normalizing developments within the LGBTQ-movements, hardly any European based research can be found on the shifts in institutionalized politics and formal democratic process. These questions rise not only from the contradictory empirical developments, but are also one of the effects of queer theory, and these are only some of the issues we want to explore together. Would you like to join us in doing that? We'll collect all the replies we have received by, put them together and return them to all those who have responded to this call. After that, we'll see what kind of interests and connections will emerge!

When: 7th International Symposium on Cultural Gerontology

Inaugural Conference of the European Network in Aging Studies (ENAS)

What: This conference aims to discuss the challenges that inter- and multidisciplinary research on aging and later life faces. Not only do disciplines such as gerontology, sociology, history, philosophy, and the arts vary in the way they question age-related matters and implement various methodologies to provide answers to these questions. They also use different sets of concepts and terminologies, or use the same concepts but define them differently. Therefore, discipline-challenging dialogues will be generated at this conference along three paradigm shifts in the cross-disciplinary study of aging.

Submission guidelines: We welcome proposals for individual papers and full panels. Proposals for papers should include the title of the paper, an abstract of 300 words, a 5-line bio of the presenter, and contact details. Proposals for panels of 4 papers should include the title of the panel, an abstract of 750 words referring to the 4 papers, a 5-line bio of the panel's chair and the other panelists, and the contact details of the chair. - **Call for Applications for the School of Critical Theory 2011, Intensive Programme: G-local Cosmopolitanism: the Social responsibility of the Academic, the Artist, and the Media (January 17 – February 4, 2011 - Utrecht University)**

What: a three week interdisciplinary and trans-national programme of intense lectures, debates and cultural exchange. The School of Critical Theory will run from January 17 - February 4, 2011. The overall theme of this three weeks intensive course is focused on cosmopolitanism and diversity in a European context. In 2011 this theme is expressed in the three clusters on the social responsibility of the artist, the academic and the media. The school offers lectures by a wide range of distinguished scholars, notably Prof. Joanna Bourke (Birkbeck), Prof. Christina Slade (City University London), Dr. Effie Yiannoupoulou (University Of Thessaloniki) and Prof. Rosi Braidotti (Utrecht University). The School also warmly welcomes exciting professional documentary-makers and artists affiliated with the International Cities of Refuge Network (ICORN).

FELLOWSHIPS

- **Erasmus Mundus Scholarships for Third Country and European Students for 2011-2013 now available**

What: The Research Centre for Women's Studies at the University of Granada is pleased to inform that the application period for Erasmus Mundus scholarships is now open for Third Country and European students and Third Country (non-European) scholars to take part in the fifth edition (2011-2013) GEMMA.

1. Erasmus Mundus scholarships for students, Category A (Third Country students) and B (European students):

The GEMMA Consortium selects eligible students on the basis of CVs, study and academic merits, motivation, recommendations, language skills, etc. The European Commission confirms this selection and officially assigns the grants.

Students should be in possession of at least a University Bachelor degree (or its equivalent: 180 ECTS, minimum 3 years of study) and should have proven knowledge of the languages of instruction of the universities in which they wish to complete their studies.

The scholarship covers: the tuition fees, medical insurance, installation costs (€4.000 per year, only for Cat. A), living expenses (€1.000 per month for Cat. A and €500 per month for Cat. B) during the two years of the master.

2. Erasmus Mundus grants for scholars:

Third Country scholars can apply for research visits at one or various GEMMA European partner institutions. These visits can last between 2 weeks and 3 months and the grant is calculated on the basis of 1.200 Euros per week.

Application deadlines: for the fifth edition of the programme 2011-2013

- 10th of January 2011 for Third Country and European students who apply for Erasmus Mundus grants
- between March 1, 2011 until April 30, 2011 for Third Country and European students who do not wish to apply for an Erasmus Mundus grant

- 30th of April 2011 for Third Country scholars

- **Four Rosalind Franklin Fellowships (Groningen University)**

What: The fellowships will be awarded to outstanding women scholars from any country and from any of the disciplines of the Faculty of Arts.

Submission guidelines: Successful candidates will set up their own research project(s) in the area of their choice, including funds to support a PhD project, and will be expected to attract external funding. They will also contribute to the (international) teaching programmes within the Faculty. The fellowship, of at most five years, comprises a salary in the range of a university lecturer, and a holiday allowance of 8%, as well as an end of year allowance. The salary and the duration of the fellowship depend on experience and qualifications. Following a favorable evaluation after at most five years, the fellow will be awarded tenure and promotion to the rank of Associate Professor, including after three more years the ius promovendi (junior professorship). After a further four to seven years another evaluation will take place and if this proves favorable, a full professorship will be awarded. The period after which tenure and full professorship will be awarded is at most five and seven years, but may be influenced by academic results of the fellow before and during the fellowship.
