Workshop with Trish Salah on 'Writing Identity's Trans-latedness' (Leiden University, NL)



Trish Salah is Assistant Professor of Transnational Studies in Gender, Sexuality, Race and Minority Cultural Production at the Department of Gender Studies, Queen's University (Kingston, Ontario, Canada). In keeping with the NOG's Research Day theme of 'Doing Gender in The Netherlands: TRANS* approaches, methods & concepts' this workshop 'Writing Identity's Trans-latedness' will consider the inscriptive act of translating sexual and gender minority identities, narratives and figures across or through legibilities, publics, canons as well as languages, cultures, national and generic registers. LOVA School of Experimental Education 2016 (University of Amsterdam, NL)

'War, militarization, violence and reconciliation: Ethnographies in Queer, Gender & Feminist Anthropology' are the topics of this years LOVA's School of Experimental Education (SEE), to be held from July 11-15, 2016, at the University of Amsterdam (NL). As anthropologists and teachers we want to invite colleagues and students to participate in a week of learning, experimental style. The focus lies on learning ethnographic methods within the frame of feminist anthropology. We encourage experimental teaching and learning by doing. Take this school as an arena of freedom, where you can think aloud, make mistakes and be inspired in a friendly co-operative environment.

Research methods such as focus groups, observation, presentation, participant observation and new conversation / interview techniques are introduced. Small field trips and excursions are an intrinsic part of the program.

Summer School 'Gender: a Core Concept in Society and Science' (Radboud University Nijmegen, NL)

The Department of Sociology and Institute for Gender Studies at Radboud University (NL) host leading research on gender inequality and dynamics, to be held from August 8-12, 2016. The course is based on RU's state of the art research and provides an advanced introduction to gender in social science in an intensive one-week programme. The course will be team-taught by nine highly acknowledged faculty members from a range of disciplinary perspectives. It is designed as an 'advanced introduction': it (1) starts with explaining core concepts and approaches in gender studies but goes beyond introductory textbook knowledge; it (2) introduces a gender perspective and applies it to contemporary debates in society and science; and (3) uses accessible language, while challenging participation in thinking very critically of our knowledge, practices and perspectives.

philosophical argument.” The 2016 European Summer School for Cultural Studies departs from the idea that this warning pertains not just to philosophical inquiry, but across academic disciplines, from literary and media studies to law, architecture and the social sciences. It is of particular urgency in a rapidly globalizing world in which the legibility of flows of capital, goods (including cultural products) and people is seen as key to prosperity and security, and in a machine-- centric universe (Lazzarato) in which an ever--larger part of the texts and images that surround us are based on binary code and algorithms. The Summer School is to be held from June 20-24, 2016 in Leiden (Mon-Wed) and Amsterdam (Thurs-Fri) and is partially open to RMA students. There is a possibility to earn 5 ECTS if certain requirements are met. **Deadline** for registration is May 15, 2016.

The Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies of Utrecht University is looking for a Postdoc in Religious Studies and Gender Studies. You will work under the supervision of prof. dr. You will publish four articles in four years and you will contribute to, and participate in, expert meetings and workshops related to the project.
